This includes the Saturday & Sunday School, a Friday evening program focused on lectures, gatherings, and speakers, providing ample opportunities for our student's learning and growth. Additionally, students can opt for the Sunday-only school if preferred. Classes are scheduled on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, with the following timings: Saturday and Sunday from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., and on Friday between Maghrib and Isha. The Dar-Al-Quran Weekend program is designed for ages 5 to 17. However, adults of any age are welcome to register for the school.

Mission

At ISG Dar-Al-Quran School, our mission is to provide a comprehensive Islamic school education that empowers students with a profound understanding of the Tawheed (monotheism), Quran, Arabic language, Seerah (Prophet's biography), Hadiths (Prophetic traditions), Adhaab (manners), and Fiqh (jurisprudence). We are committed to nurturing young minds with the timeless wisdom and teachings of Islam, fostering spiritual growth, and preparing them to lead exemplary lives as compassionate and knowledgeable members of the global community.

Vision

Sunday-Only Dar-Al-Quran School

Also, Friday evening is available to everyone (Sunday-only, and others). This means that anyone interested in exploring the teachings of Islam and benefiting from our diverse range of topics is more than welcome to join us.

Please note: The evening on Fridays is exclusively dedicated to educational purposes, so we kindly request students to display appropriate behavior and discipline. Parents are also welcome to accompany their children.

- **Focus on Spiritual Reflection:** The lecture-based program offers an opportunity for spiritual reflection, reminders, and Islamic knowledge for Students. Friday evenings are optional to students.
- **Supplemental Learning:** This option serves as a supplementary source of Islamic education for those who attend regular schooling during weekdays but still wish to deepen their knowledge of Islam on weekends.

Overall, each option caters to different needs and preferences, making it possible for individuals from diverse backgrounds to engage in Islamic learning and spiritual development at their own pace and availability. Level 1:

- 1. **Basic Islamic Concepts:** Introduce young children or new students to the oneness of Allah (Tawheed) and simple concepts of Islamic beliefs and practices, such as the Five Pillars of Islam.
- 2. **Islamic Manners and Ethics:** Teach students basic adhaab (manners) and etiquettes in daily life, emphasizing kindness, respect, and gratitude towards others.
- 3. **Introduction to Quran and Memorization of Short Surahs:** Memorization of Surah Al-Adiyat to Surah An-Nas (last Rub), basic Quranic verses to start building a connection with the Quran.
- 4. **Arabic Languages**: Familiarize students with the Arabic alphabets and covers the book of Noorani Qa'idah, learning the Arabic alphabet and simple words.
- 5. **Introduction to Prophet Muhammad (pbuh):** Share age-appropriate stories from the Prophet's life to inspire love and admiration for his character and teachings, covers from births until the first revelation.

- **Hadith Studies:** Introduction to Hadith terminology and classification and Learning Hadiths related to character and ethics.
- **Arabic Language:** Educate students to start reading Arabic words and review of Noorani Qa'idah.

Responsibility for Parents and Children

We are delighted to have you and your child or any new student as part of our educational community. Before proceeding with your enrollment, we kindly ask you to carefully read and acknowledge the following guidelines and expectations to ensure a safe and productive learning environment for everyone involved.

Semester Assessments

To ensure academic progress and maintain educational standards, assessments will be conducted at the beginning of every semester. These assessments are designed to gauge the student's understanding of the curriculum and to provide valuable feedback for further improvement.

Repeat of Level

In the event that a student does not successfully pass the semester assessment, they will be required to repeat the same level in the following year. This measure is aimed at reinforcing foundational knowledge and promoting a deeper understanding of the subject matter.

Timely Pick-up and Drop-off

Our school hours are from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM. We place great importance on punctuality, and we expect all students to arrive and picked up on time. To ensure the safety and smooth operation of our school, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Arrival and Sign-in: Parents are required to sign in their children at the masjid's front desk when
 dropping them off. Please ensure your child arrives at school on time to make the most of the
 learning opportunities. Parents should accompany students during pick up and drop off
 school. Please refer to the provided schedule for specific timings.
- **Pick-up Deadline:** School concludes promptly at 1:00 PM. We kindly request that all students be picked up and signed out by no later than 1:10 PM. After this time, the masjid will charge a fee of \$1 for every additional minute to cover the cost of staff overtime.
- Dhuhr Prayer: If you choose to stay for Dhuhr prayer following the school session at 1:00 PM, we welcome you to do so. However, please ensure that your children are next to you and that they are well-behaved during the prayer. Running, shouting, or talking out loud during this time is strictly prohibited.

Behavior and Respect

We expect all students to conduct themselves with the utmost respect and courtesy towards their teachers, peers, and the sacred space of the masjid. Running or engaging in disruptive behavior

within the masjid premises is strictly prohibited. Students are encouraged to listen attentively to their teachers and follow instructions promptly.

Parental Accompaniment

If a student faces challenges in maintaining proper behavior, we request parents or guardians to accompany them until their behavior has improved. Your support and guidance will contribute to the child's growth and learning experience positively.

Parental Responsibility

We emphasize that parents play an essential role in their child's educational journey. It is the parent's responsibility to ensure their child behaves well in the classroom and adheres to the school's guidelines. - **4. Attitude**: Maintain a serious and professional demeanor in the classroom while being gentle and compassionate with students. Ensure that discipline is exercised with kindness and understanding.

- **5. Attendance:** Take attendance at the beginning of each class to ensure accurate records of student participation.
- **6. Communication:** If you have concerns regarding a student's behavior or academic progress, communicate privately with the student's parents. Constructive dialogue and collaboration with parents are crucial for students' improvement.

Snacks and Refreshments

Please note that no snacks or food will be provided by the school. We kindly request parents to provide minimum snacks for their children/student, if necessary, to ensure they have refreshments during break times.

Books

- Textbook(s) and workbook(s) will be provided to students by the school.
- Parents may be requested to procure additional books.
- It is expected that students care for the provided books and label them with their names.
- Every weekend, students are required to bring all their books to school.
- If a second copy of a book needs to be acquired, the school will incur the associated cost.

Homework

Assignments are meant to be completed at home and will vary depending on the level and subject. Homework serves to expand on skills and concepts introduced in class, encouraging a deeper understanding through independent study.

- The responsibility to complete and submit assignments on time lies with the student.
- In cases of absence, students are accountable for making up missed work.
- Regularly monitoring your child's homework is expected of parents, as it offers insight into their school progress and overall Islamic knowledge.
- Incomplete homework can adversely affect a student's performance. We aim to provide a chance for students to assume responsibility and experience the triumph of independent

learning. Expect weekly homework and engage with your child about it. Distributing the workload across the week is recommended over a single day.

Grading and Report Cards:

Grading serves to provide parents with essential information about their child's efforts and academic accomplishments. Grades are paramount in helping students understand their academic standing. As parents and educators, we share the responsibility of guiding students towards improving their academic strengths and overcoming weaknesses.

- Each academic year includes chapter exams, a midterm, and a final exam. Additional exams may be administered at the teacher's discretion.
- A final report card will be issued to every student at the conclusion of the school year.

Dress Code

To preserve the sanctity of ISG Dar-Al-Quran School, appropriate dress is mandatory for all students within the Masjid premises. We urge parents to ensure that their children maintain a standard of dress that reflects respect for the masjid's etiquettes and Muslim values.

- Modest, loosely fitting attire is recommended for both boys and girls.
- Girls are required to wear a non-transparent hijab.
- Long sleeve shirts are mandatory for girls.
- Attire displaying inappropriate imagery is strictly prohibited.
- We trust parents to exemplify these dress code rules as role models for their children and follow them while on the masjid's premises.

Personal Property

- Parents are responsible for monitoring their child's personal items brought to school daily.
- Students are expected to label all school supplies, belongings, and accessories, aiding in lost and found scenarios.
- Personal items such as electronics and toys are considered disruptive and are not permitted on school premises. Students may bring phones for personal use outside of instructional time, with permission. Phones should not be used without permission while in class.
- Students are required to place their shoes on shoe racks and hang their coats on hangers.
